

Letter from the Founder & CEO

2022 was quite the year for us at CARE STL; lots of ups and downs, lots of successes, and lots of animals were saved. A total of 3,012 animals were cared for by 23 full-time staff members (caregivers, adoption team & training team), which was 572 more animals cared for than the previous year. This is an increase of 25%, which is unbelievable! 1,945 animals were placed in their forever homes, and 289 were reunited with their owners.

We have significantly increased the in-shelter enrichment for our dogs by hiring certified professional dog trainers, as well as now offering free training for the public, which is already completely booked solid! Three new play yards (an enrichment yard, a sensory garden yard, and a play yard) were added for our shelter dogs, providing them additional space to destress while waiting for their forever homes. We also now offer \$10 microchip ID's to the community; not just for city residents but for everyone! And thanks to a lifesaving grant we received from Petco, we were able to buy an ID tag machine, so all the dogs & cats that leave our building are provided with free ID tags and collars.

It's mind-boggling to think that just four years ago, when we took over the management of the STL City shelter, the intake number was just 600-800 animals a year, while last year, we took in 3012! We were only able to survive this massive influx of animals because of the help of our incredibly committed volunteers, who contributed a total of 15,847 hours helping in the shelter and enriching animals. Our overall reach as an organization has grown so much over this time, but so has the total number of animals that keep coming into the shelter. We are continually challenged to raise additional funds for the medical costs involved with many animals entering our shelter. So many of them are injured, sick, and malnourished, which is why we ask and ask and ask again for the funds & tools we need to help them all.



Lifesaving Intake, Compassionate Sheltering & Adoption into Loving Homes

CARE STL accepts homeless, abused, neglected, injured, and surrendered animals into our care until they can be adopted into loving homes. We are an open, admission shelter that does not turn away any animal from within the City of St. Louis's jurisdiction. We do not euthanize animals for lack of space or for those with treatable behavioral or medical conditions.



Spay & Neuter - a lifesaving program

Spaying and neutering help reduce companion animal overpopulation. It helps lower the euthanasia rate by decreasing the number of unwanted animals.



The CARE Emergency Medical Fund exists to treat conditions that require specialist diagnostics, treatments and surgeries, and intensive monitoring that our clinic is not equipped to treat. We send our animals to the region's best specialty and emergency clinics. CARE STL relies on the generosity of individuals, corporations, and foundations for all medical care costs and trauma cases of the animals we rescue. When you donate to CARE STL, your financial support helps to sustain our mission of saving thousands of lives each year, and your support goes directly to the animals that were picked up in your backyard--the City of St. Louis. These animals are indeed part of the St. Louis community.

In 2022, we spent \$76,330 from the CARE Emergency Medical Fund to give the best outcomes for the dogs and cats in our care. Yet, the animals keep coming to us for help and hope for a better life. Many of them come to us with complex, serious medical issues – we treat them with the same level of love, care, and commitment to emotional, mental, and physical healing.


Training & Enrichment at CARE


We have significantly increased our in-shelter enrichment for our dogs by hiring a newly certified trainer and are proud to offer free training for the public now. Three new play yards were added for our shelter dogs & 2,385 enrichment hours were given to shelter dogs!



















Community Outreach

With the help of our community partners Petco, Dana Brown, Athletes for Animals, Purina, the City Department of Health, and our city officials, we provided off-site, low-cost microchipping, and vaccination services in under-resourced communities. We are able to serve free vaccinations, low-cost microchipping, and wellness checks for community-owned pets. We offer \$10 microchips for the community (not just city residents!) and give an ID tag and collar to every dog that leaves our shelter. We now offer rabies tags and registration for all city animals; the information will be in our system, so it's easy to reunite them when they get lost.















Volunteering at CARE STL

As a nonprofit organization, our ability to staff our shelter is limited. Without our volunteers, we would not be able to operate on the scale necessary to handle such a large volume of dogs every year. 
















A NEW SHELTER?

Since CARE's inception in 2018, our City shelter's annual intake of animals has risen steadily each and every year. Our average shelter occupancy is THREE times what it was when CARE's contract with the City first began. City residents rely on us to provide safe haven and resources for strays, surrendered, injured, and missing pets, so we anticipate our average shelter population to continue to increase to an even greater extent in the future. Therefore the need for a new, larger shelter for us is crucial to continue to serve the community and our animals humanely and more efficiently. At the very core of this need is our current lack of kennel space to house the sheer volume of animals that come thru our doors. We shelter stray animals, abandoned animals, confiscated animals, abuse cases, bite cases, aggressive animals, and animals who will eventually be returned to their owners. For us to do this properly, there has to be an upgrade in their housing conditions for their health, well-being, safety, and the safety of our staff.

Shelter overcrowding creates an unhealthy, risky environment for animals and staff alike. Highly stressed dogs' aggressive behavior towards other animals and people, emotional trauma and anxiety, and infectious disease transmission. We need a building with proper ventilation and truly medically quarantined areas to control disease outbreaks and allow stressed, injured animals to decompress and heal for more safe handling ability and decreased risk of injury to staff and other animals.

The list of "why" goes on and on, and the time to make it happen is today. This affects all of us in the community - pets get lost or go missing from yards daily, and citizens find pets roaming constantly and rely on our services. We can only continue assisting our community if we have a safe place to house the animals in our care.

We want to build a long-term solution for the future of our City's homeless animals. We encourage you to share your love and generosity towards them by leaving a legacy.
